

SELECTMEN'S MEETING

May 10, 1979

Present were Roland Sallada, Thomas Mansfield, Merrill Todd and Betty Hooper.

A building permit was issued to James and Rosalie Lyons.

Mr. Warran Moss and Mr. Howard Mudge were asked to come in in regard to the drain problems in their area causing a swamp on the Lovejoy property across the road. Mr. Moss was upset with the draining of the swamp, the water flowing near his new well and the well water of both houses being affected at the time of the draining of the swamp.

Kenneth Molbrook stopped by to report that two flower urns had been stolen from his father's grave.

Louis Kachavos came in to review his Current Use form.

Bo Strong presented a bill for repairs to the town hall septic system. The Selectmen asked his wife, Nancy, ~~is~~ if she would be interested in taking the appointment of dog officer. She accepted.

Chairman of the Conservation Commission, Martha Brooks, came in in regard to the 'cease and desist' order extended to Milton Elliott from the N. H. Dredge and Fill Commission. Mr. Elliott is putting fill on his property which is halting proper drainage. He had not requested a permit, therefore was acting illegally.

Dr. Brooks reported on two septic systems, namely the Bishop lot and the Farellla lot, which are of poor structure and should not have been approved, therefore he has advised these owners to 'cease and desist' further operation until checked out.

Betsy Moore, representative of the Town Hallk Committee, came in to schedule a date for a meeting with the Selectmen on Thursday May 17 for the purpose of reviewing the progress of the new rules for the Town Hall.

Police Chief, John Ballou, came in to report that the special telephone line which is hooked into the County Dispatch Office in Goffstown (voted at Town Meeting) is now completed meaning that now New Boston citizens will have a 24-hour answering service.
