

Selectmen's Meeting November 7, 1988

Present were Selectmen Olson, Mansfield, Dodge and secretary.

- 7:10 Ronald Cook from Sanco Company Bethlehem, N.H. came in to inform the Selectmen that they would take New Boston trash. Household trash would be \$40.50/ton plus \$5.00 scale fee. \$65.00/ton for demolition materials. \$.37/gal. for leach aid disposal and \$2.50/passenger tire. Sanco Company takes 60% of New Hampshire trash and 40% from other states. The company was established for New Hampshire customers and when the time comes they will drop out of state customers.
- 8:30 A temporary trailer hearing was held for Richard Matherson 255 Riverdale Road, New Boston, N.H. Notices were sent to the abutters, Est. of Donald K. Holt, Sr., Harold Strong, Richard Stewart and Jade Realty. Only one abutter present, Harold Strong. Selectmen granted Mr. Matherson a temporary two (2) year permit while constructing his home on the same location. The permit expires on November 8, 1990.
- 9:05 Nannu Nobis came in to review the contract for covering the landfill. A bid bond for the contractor would be 5%-10% of the contract. A performance bond to meet all conditions and the amount will be the bid price. A payment bond to protect the Town if the contractor does not make his subcontractors show proof of insurance. The contractor will be responsible to have all permits required by the State of N.H.
- 10:05 Lee Murray, Road Agent came in with Albert Rivet for the position of truck driver on the highway department. Mr. Rivet is married with 2 children. He is presently employed as a finished carpenter. He has a light commercial license. However, he has not had plowing experience. He has worked for Tech Wood Industries making deliveries. His driving record is clean.
- 10:15 Peter Richard Bedford Road, New Boston, N.H. came in for the position of truck driver on the highway department. He has been laid off from a pipe fitter position. Mr. Richard has never plowed snow and does not have a commercial license. His present driving record is good.
- 10:30 Lorraine Barney was in to discuss her problem regarding her property extending into the Town right-of-way. It was agreed by all present that this situation had been allowed to exist and further investigation would take place by all involved so that Mrs. Barney would be able to proceed with the re-financing of her property which was her majority concern of the moment. Options were discussed between all parties involved including how the situation might be resolved and Mrs. Barney would ultimately have clear title to her property and the Town would not be left with an expensive lot line or road entry problem to resolve.
