

Minutes Selectmen's Meeting - September 18, 1989

Present for the meeting were Selectman Willard Dodge and Sandra Gendron taking minutes. Selectmen Thomas Mansfield and Arthur Johnston were on vacation and unavailable for this meeting.

At 7:00 pm representatives from the 4-H Foundation Brent Armstrong, Rodney Stark and Bob Rheault, the gravel contractor for the 4-H were in to discuss the possibility of using trailer dumps for hauling gravel for a specific job. These 18-wheel vehicles were not permitted in the current gravel permit. Mr. Rheault had an opportunity to bid a job in the Salem, N. H. area which would require between 2500 and possibly 5000 yards of material. In order for him to give a competitive price he felt he would have to have the opportunity to employ the larger equipment for this job. Selectman Dodge was hesitant to make a firm decision on his own; however, he did agree to Mr. Rheault removing 2500 yards of material with the heavier equipment if he were awarded the bid and seeing how things went. It was further agreed that Mr. Rheault would call the Town Office if he was going to haul with the heavier equipment. Selectman Dodge suggested to Brent that the Foundation might want to consider moving the manure pile from the barn to a location further away from the river. Mr. Rheault agreed to use his loader to move the pile before it got any closer to the river.

Due to the presence of only one Selectman no other appointments were scheduled and the meeting was adjourned.
